4.2.1 Creating object imports

First create object imports ("Configuration > Import & Export > Object imports") for the structure definitions present in the CSV Export Nuclet

- "CSV Export Type" and
- "CSV File Encoding".

For these imports you can use the supplied CSV files "CSV_Export_Type.csv" and "CSV_File_Encoding.csv" (found in the subdirectory "data" of the ZIP file "CSV-Export-v1.0.0.zip").

3.2.2 Run object imports

Please run the object imports created in step 3.2.1 so that all necessary master data is in the system. After running them, the master data records listed in sections 3.2.2.1 and 3.2.2.2 should be present in your system.

UTF-8	UTF-8	Eight-bit UCS Transformation Format
UTF-16BE	UTF-16BE	Sixteen-bit UCS Transformation Format, big-endian byte order
UTF-16LE	UTF-16LE	Sixteen-bit UCS Transformation Format, little-endian byte order
UTF-16	UTF-16	Sixteen-bit UCS Transformation Format, byte order identified by an optional byte-order mark
